PREAMBLE:-

The Andhra Valley Power Supply Company Ltd., & The Tata Hydro
Electric Power Supply Company Ltd., (the "Transferor Company) vide a Scheme of
Amalgamation under Section 391 to 394 of the Companies Act, 1956, have been
merged into The Tata Power Company Ltd. (the "Transferee Company"). The
Scheme of Amalgamation was sanctioned by the High Court of Judicature at
Bombay by its order on the respective petitions, on 18th October 2000.

In view of the sanction of the High Court, the Transferor companies are
dissolved & their entire Undertaking stands transferred to the Transferee company.
The Scheme provides that all approvals, consents, licenses, registrations, and
other benefits in connection with or related to the Undertaking of the Transferor
companies would automatically vest in the Transferee company.

RESOLUTION:-

Since the vesting has taken place by virtue of the Court orders, dated 18th
October 2000, the Government of Maharashtra accords its consent under Section
9(2) of Indian Electricity Act, 1910, to transfer of following licenses.

- i) The Bombay (Hydro-Electric) License, 1907 formerly held
by the Tata Hydro Electric Power Supply Company Ltd.
- ii) Andhra Valley (Hydro-Electric) License, 1919 formerly held by
the Andhra Valley Power Supply Company Ltd.,

- iii) The Trombay Thermal Power Electric License, 1953, held jointly by the Tata Hydro Electric Power Supply Company Ltd., The Andhra Valley Power Supply Company Ltd. & The Tata Power Company Ltd.

Dorabji Jamsetji Tata and Ruttonji Jamsetji Tata for supply of Electrical Energy in Bombay :—

Bombay (Hydro-Electric) License, 1907.

LICENSE granted by the Government of Bombay under the Indian Electricity Act, 1903, in respect of the City and Island of Bombay to DORABJI JAMSETJI TATA, Esq., and RUTTONJI JAMSETJI TATA, Esq., both of Navsari Buildings, Hornby Road, Fort, Bombay, for the supply of energy to the public.

Short Title.

1. This license may be cited as "The Bombay (Hydro-Electric) License, 1907."

Interpretation.

2. This license is to be read and construed as subject in all respects to the provisions of the Indian Electricity Act, 1903, herein referred to as "the Act," and the several words, terms and expressions to which by the Act and the Rules thereunder meanings are assigned shall have in this license the same respective meaning, provided that in this license—

The expression "the licensees" shall mean and include the said Dorabji Jamsetji Tata and Ruttonji Jamsetji Tata, and their permitted assigns.

The expressions "first annexure," "second annexure," "third annexure," and "fourth annexure" shall mean the first, second, third and fourth annexures to this license, respectively.

The expression "deposited map" shall mean the plan of the area of supply deposited by the licensees with the Local Government in pursuance of the terms of this license.

The expression "deposited map of route of transmission" shall mean the plan showing the districts in which, and the route by which, the aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply will be placed, and which is deposited by the licensees with the Local Government.

The expression "the Corporation" shall mean the Municipal Corporation of the City of Bombay for the time being.

**The expression "other licensees" shall mean any person or persons (other than the Licensees) who are duly authorised by a license for the time being in force under the Act to supply energy to the public within the area of supply of the Licensee or some part thereof and includes the Maharashtra State Electricity Board.

Commencement of License.

3. This license shall come into force and have effect upon the day when the notification confirming this license is published in the ~~Bombay Government Gazette~~, which date is referred to in this license as "the commencement of this license."

Area of Supply.

*4. The area of supply shall be the whole of the area described in Part 1 of the First Annexure, which said area is more particularly delineated

line, but excluding therefrom every cantonment, fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, building or other place in the occupation of the Government of India or Bombay for Naval or Military purposes, situate within or partly within such area.

***With effect from the 1st July 1980 the Licensees shall transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board the distribution rights and also transfer to Maharashtra State Electricity Board the assets pertaining thereto as set out in Part II of the First Annexure. With a view to arriving at a mutually acceptable agreement in good time, the Licensees shall on or before the 1st July 1984 commence discussions with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board for delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights under this licence which is to be effective from the 1st July 1985, in respect of the Licensees' area of supply now covered by the licence in favour of Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Limited (B.S.E.S.). In such discussions the guiding principle shall be that the Licensees will be allowed to retain such distribution rights and loads in the said Area as may be warranted by surplus generating capacity of the Licensees after meeting the requirements in the area served by Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking (B.E.S.T.) as well as the Licensees' bulk supplies to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board at various points. In the event of the Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board failing to reach any agreement on the aforesaid issue of such delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights by the 31st December 1984, the State Government shall be entitled to decide the said issue/s and to amend this licence as the Government may in its absolute discretion think fit.

Provision in respect of Streets on Port Trust Land.

5. When the soil of any street in the area of supply is vested in the Trustees of the Port of Bombay, but such Trustees are not the authority responsible for the repair of such street as referred to in Section 13 of the Act, the licensees shall nevertheless serve upon the said Trustees, as well as upon the proper repairing authority, the notice required by the said Section 13, previous to the execution of any works involving the placing of any works in, under, over, along or across such street and the provisions of the said Section 13 shall apply as if the said Trustees were also the authority responsible for the repair of such street.

Purposes of Supply.

6. (i) Subject to the provisions of this license, of the Act, of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, and of the Rules thereunder, energy shall be supplied under this license for all purposes including supply to other licensees for their own purposes and in bulk: Provided that the licensees shall not be under obligation to supply energy in bulk to other licensees *other than the Maharashtra State Electricity Board for the purpose of enabling such other licensees to supply any consumer whose maximum demand exceeds 250 KVA, except that in the case of the under-mentioned other licensees the maximum demand limit shall be:

1,000 KVA for a consumer in the area of supply of the Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Company Limited.

In respect of the consumers of Maharashtra State Electricity Board, the Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall draw power at 22 KV from the receiving stations of the Licensees to the extent of the transformation capacities of the said receiving stations.

These demand limits shall, in the case of a factory, be the total requirements of the consumer, estimated on the basis of plant and machinery to be installed in his factory premises for meeting his full production schedule as envisaged in his industrial license at the time he begins operation and not on the basis of the load at which he begins to operate, nor on the basis of future expansion which may result in amendments to his industrial license.

These limits are open to amendment by the Government, when circumstances so warrant, generally or individually in respect of the abovementioned other licensees in consultation with the Licensees, and the amendments so made shall be notified by Government in the Government Gazette. The Licensees may, however, with the written consent of the Government supply energy in bulk to the other licensees mentioned above for enabling them to supply any person whose demand exceeds the limit specified above or as amended and so notified in the Gazette.

(II) The energy supplied under this license to any consumer for power may be used by such consumer for lighting his premises provided that the energy used by such consumer for such lighting purposes shall not in any year exceed twenty per centum of the total amount of energy supplied to such consumer.

(III) In the event of any difference or dispute arising between the Licensees and other licensees by reason of any objection by the other licensees raised in any case of supply made by the Licensees under sub-clause (I) of this clause, or in regard to the interpretation of the terms of any part of sub-clause (I) of this clause, such dispute shall be referred to an arbitrator appointed by the Government on the application of either party and the decision of such arbitrator shall be final.

Works and System of Supply.

7. The systems which may be adopted for the supply of electrical energy under this license are the following :—

- (I) (a) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between the adjacent conductors of a three-wire system, the intermediate conductor being connected to earth at the transforming station, but insulated at all other parts.
- (b) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between conductors of a two-wire system.
- (c) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 600 volts for power purposes where the approval of the Local Government is given.
- (II) (a) A low pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between phases at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second.
- (b) A high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 3,000 volts and at a frequency of ~~50 complete periods per second for power purposes~~ where the approval of the Local Government is given.
- (III) An extra high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 20,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second, the neutral point of the transformers being, with the approval of the Local Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority, connected to earth.

high pressure alternating current three-phase aerial transmission lines at a pressure not exceeding 60,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second for connecting the Generating Station outside the area of supply mentioned in Clause 10 with the Receiving Station to be situated within the same area, the neutral point of the generators being, with the approval of the Local Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority, connected to earth.

*Provided that the Licensees may with the prior permission in writing of the State Government suitably connect its 500 MW Power Station at Trombay to the 220 KV switchyard of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board at Trombay.

Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Local Government from time to time to issue regulations dealing with the above systems, or, to authorise other systems to be adopted for the purposes of this license.

The mains and distributing mains and service lines within the area of supply shall either be underground or aerial lines, provided always that nothing in this license shall be deemed to empower the licensees to place aerial lines (including the aerial lines mentioned in sub-clause IV of this clause) along or across any street unless and until the Local Government, after consulting the local authority, has communicated to the licensees a general approval in writing of the position and methods of construction of such lines. The aerial transmission lines described in sub-clause (iv) of this clause shall, in so far as the same will be within the area of supply, be placed according to the alignment indicated by a blue line on the deposited map and shall be erected, constructed and maintained by the licensees in strict conformity with the rules in that behalf for the time being in force under the Act.

The licensees shall at their own cost erect and maintain sufficient guard wires at all places where any wires or mains of the licensees shall be placed so as to cross above or be liable to fall upon or be blown on to the electric-conductors of any Tramway.

Power to break up private streets, Railways and Tramways.

8. In pursuance of the provisions of Section 12, sub-section (4) of the Act the licensees are hereby specially authorised to break up the streets not repairable by the Local Government or by a local authority, which are mentioned in the second annexure to this license, and also the railways and tramways which are mentioned in the said annexure, so far only as concerns level crossings and parts of the railways or tramways running along the highway on the level.

Protection for existing tramways of the Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Company, Limited.

9. Where the exercise of the powers of the licensees will involve the placing of any works alongside any rail or any existing tramway of the Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Company, Limited, the provisions of Sections 14, 15 and 16 of the Act shall with any necessary modifications apply and have effect as if such works were placed over or under such tramway.

Transmission Lines from Generating Station.

10. For the purpose of conveying and transmitting energy to the area of supply the licensees may upon obtaining from the Governor-General in Council such (if any) of the powers referred to in Section 35 of the Act as may be necessary, and from the Local Government the general approval required by Section 17 of the Act, place aerial transmis-

... from a generating station constructed or to be constructed near Khopoli in the Karjat Taluka of the Colaba Collectorate, to and up to a Receiving Station to be constructed on some site within the area of supply but not being outside the limits defined by a green line on the deposited map. The said aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply are to be placed according to the alignment indicated by a blue line on the deposited map of route of transmission or such other alignment as may be required by the Governor-General in Council.

The licensees are also authorised for the purposes of this clause to cross the navigable creeks and arms of the sea specified in the fourth annexure to this license.

Maximum Charges.

***11. The prices to be charged by the Licensees for energy supplied by them to their consumers shall be regulated by the requirements of the Sixth Schedule and the other applicable provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, or of any other enactment for the time being in force, in amendment or in substitution thereof.

Applications for Supply of power.

12. The licensees shall, as soon as conveniently may be but not later than nine months after the registration of the Company contemplated by Clause 15 hereunder, publish by advertisement in the **Bombay Government Gazette** and in three local daily newspapers, the detailed conditions under which they propose to supply energy under this license and inviting application for such supply upon a date therein mentioned not later than four weeks from the date of the first publication of such advertisement. Applications for supply of energy shall be dealt with by the licensees in priority according to the date of their receipt on or subsequent to such date as aforesaid, but so nevertheless that the licensees shall be entitled to require proof or security that the applicant for supply will be able to carry out the contract sought for by him, and that in the event of two or more applications being received simultaneously the licensees may select the application or applications seeking for the longer term contract or contracts.

Limits of Licensees' Obligation to Supply Energy.

13. The licensees shall not be under any obligation, under Section 21 of the Act, to supply more energy than is consistent with their obligation to maintain a constant supply to consumers, due regard being had to the capacity of the licensees' water-storage; but, in addition they may supply to consumers willing to take energy on condition of a surplus being available.

Purchase of Undertaking.

***14. The option of purchase, given by Section 6 of the Act, shall be exercisable first on the expiry of the period ending on the 15th August 2014 (Government having already agreed with the Licensees to waive the exercise of the earlier options for the purchase of such undertaking, the last of which expires on the 15th August 2004), and if not so exercised, then at the end of every subsequent period of ten years during the subsistence of this licence. In that event, the amount payable for all lands, buildings, works, materials and plants of the Licensees shall be the value determined in accordance with the provisions of law in force at the time of such purchase and there shall be added to such value so computed as aforesaid, on account of compulsory purchase, such solatium as may be payable under the law applicable in the State for the time being. In case of such law providing for such solatium to be based on the provisions in the Licence, the Licensees shall be entitled to ten per cent solatium.

covered by this license, no part or parts of the Undertaking covered by any separate licence granted by Government for a thermal station to the same Licensees shall be taken into consideration.

Assignment of the License.

*15. At any time after the commencement of this license, the licensee may, with the previous consent in writing of Government, assign this license and transfer the whole of the undertaking in respect of which this license is granted (including all lands, buildings, works, materials and plant of the licensee) to any individual or body to be formed and registered in accordance with law for the time being in force or a body established or which may be established by any law or enactment for the time being in force in India.

Exclusion from License of Certain clauses in Schedule to Act—

**16. The provisions contained in Clauses IV, V, VII, VIII and XII of the Schedule to the Act shall be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license; and the other provisions contained in the said Schedule shall also be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license insofar as they are inconsistent with its terms. Clause VI shall also be excepted in respect of consumers referred to in clause (6) (1) of this license making a demand less than the limits specified therein.

17. The licensees shall not generate energy otherwise than by water power for the purposes of the supply contemplated by this license, provided that they may use other power for subsidiary purposes not being in substitution for, or augmentation of, Hydro-Electric generation.

Security Deposit

***18. The extent of the State Government's participation in financing the 500 MW Trombay project shall not exceed Rs. 25 crores, of which Rs. 15 crores will be raised by the Licensees by collecting security deposits in cash from their existing consumers which shall notionally be treated as the contribution of the State Government. The balance contribution of the State Government shall be limited to Rs. 10 crores which shall be suitably deferred to a date as required by the State Government. The composition of the above contribution in terms of loan and equity shall be decided by the State Government at a later date. This arrangement shall be subject to such revision as may be agreed to between the Licensees and the State Government.

The Licensees shall take immediate steps to collect security deposits in cash from all their consumers excluding other Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board in a phased manner to reduce the burden on consumers.

The entire amount of security deposits as collected by the Licensees as stated above shall be treated as part of Government's contribution for the financing of the said project.

FIRST ANNEXURE

PART I

***Area of Supply

- (1) The area contained within the limits of the City of Bombay is defined by section 3(10) of the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1904.
- (2) The whole of that portion of the Island of Salsette, as is bounded on the South by the Town and Island of Bombay and on the North by the Bassein and Thana Creeks.
- (3) The area contained within a circle of eight miles radius round the Licensee's sub-station at Kalyan but excluding therefrom the area west of the centre line of the crest of the Parsik range hills.
- (4) The area contained within the limits of the Municipal Borough of Lonavla in Poona District.
- (5) The area contained within the Municipal limits of Panvel in Kolaba District.

PART II

**Rationalisation of Distribution

(Effective 1st July 1980)

(1) The Licensees will transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, the Licensees' existing and future consumers, distribution rights, the Licensees' sub-stations, supply facilities and assets at consumers' premises in the following areas:—

- (i) Panvel Licence area.
- (ii) Bhiwandi Licence area.
- (iii) Lonavla-Khandala Licence area, excluding 22/6.6 K.V. distribution lines from Khopoli which serve the Licensees' headworks.
- (iv) Bassein Licence area.

The Licensees will continue to supply power at 100/22/6.6 KV at the above sub-stations/points of supply, as the case may be, for a mutually agreed period to enable the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to make its own arrangements.

(2) The Licensees will surrender their distribution rights in Kalyan and Ambernath areas except for the right of bulk supply to—

- (i) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board, and
- (ii) Ordnance Factory at Ambernath at 100 KV.

The Licensees will retain all their present assets in these areas except the outgoing 22 KV lines from Kalyan and Ambernath Receiving Stations and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers' sub-stations.

area served by their 22 KV distribution system excepting for the right of bulk supply to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. The Licensees will retain all their present assets in this area excepting the outgoing 22 KV feeders from their Kolshet Receiving Station and the Licensees terminal equipment at the consumers sub-stations.

(4) The Licensees are agreeable to permit the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to take over all their present and future direct consumers in the erstwhile Thana Electricity Supply Company License area. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall receive power from the Licensees' Salsette and Kolshet Receiving Stations at 22 KV. The Licensees will retain all their assets in these areas excepting the outgoing feeders and the terminal equipment at the consumers' end. In addition, the Licensees will retain the following consumers and feeders :

- (i) Bombay Municipal Corporation (BMC) at 100 KV.
- (ii) The Licensees' feeders from the Salsette Receiving Station supplying to the Bombay Suburban Electricity Supply area.

(5) The capacities of the Licensees' transformers at Ambernath, Kalyan and Kolshet 100/22 KV Receiving Stations will be frozen by the Licensees as on the 30th June 1980, unless otherwise mutually agreed to augment the capacity further. The Licensees shall have the right to supply and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall draw power at 22 KV from these Receiving Stations to the extent of transformation capacity already set up by that time. The transformation capacity is understood to mean capacities of all transformers in service and those under installation and required to be installed upto the 30th June 1980.

(6) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board will have the right to bring in its own transmission Lines and set up its own Receiving Stations, in the entire area of the Licensees excluding the area currently served by the B.E.S.T. and the Bombay Suburban Electricity Supply at any date after the 30th June, 1980. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board may take such advance action as may be necessary for the purpose and keep the Licensees informed suitably. The Licensees shall offer all co-operation and accommodation in allowing crossing of their lines by Maharashtra State Electricity Board's lines. When Maharashtra State Electricity Board create such facilities it will be ensured that loads supplied at that time by the Licensees from their Receiving Stations in the areas handed over are not reduced except for marginal adjustments.

(7) The transfer of assets on rationalisation of distribution shall be on the basis of the provisions of clause 14 of this Licence.

(8) If the Government is satisfied that it has not been possible for the Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to reach agreement on any point or points mentioned in this part or the Licensee has not been giving to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board adequate co-operation and accommodation as required under any of the above provisions in this part, it will be competent to the Government to issue to the Licensee such directions as the Government may in its absolute discretion think necessary for the purpose and thereupon the Licensee shall be under an obligation to abide by the same.

LICENSE granted by the Government of Bombay under the Indian Electricity Act 1910, in respect of the City of Bombay, the Municipal areas of Kurla, Bandra, Matheran, Kalyan, Thane and Ghatkopar-Kirol and certain local areas respectively near the Railway Stations of Andheri, Santa Cruz and Vile Parle on the Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway which are duly constituted notified areas under Chapter XIV of the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901, to THE TATA HYDRO-ELECTRIC POWER SUPPLY COMPANY, LIMITED, a Company registered under the Indian Companies Act, 1882, and having its Registered Office at Navsari Buildings, Hornby Road, Fort, Bombay, for the supply of Electrical Energy in the areas, with the powers and upon the terms and conditions all specified below.

Short Title

1. This license may be cited as "The Andhra Valley (Hydro-Electric) License, 1919".

Interpretation

2. The several words, terms and expressions to which by the Indian Electricity Act, 1910 or by the Rules thereunder, meanings are assigned shall have in this license the same respective meanings provided that in this License:—

- (1) The expression "the Act" shall mean The Indian Electricity Act, 1910.
- (2) The expression "the Government" shall mean the Government of Bombay.
- (3) The expression "the Licensees" shall mean and include The Tata Hydro-Electric Power Supply Company, Limited and its permitted assigns.
- (4) The expressions "First Annexure," "Second Annexure," "Third Annexure," and "Fourth Annexure" shall mean the first, second, third and fourth annexures to this license, respectively.
- ** (5) The expression 'deposited map' shall mean the plan or map which is signed for purposes of identification by the Secretary (Energy) to the Government of Maharashtra in the Industries, Energy and Labour Department and Managing Director of the Licensees, and which has been deposited with the Government of Maharashtra by the Licensees in pursuance of the Rules under the Act and which shows the area of supply hereinafter specified.
- * (6) The expression "other licensees" shall mean any person or persons (other than the Licensees) who are duly authorised by a license for the time being in force under the Act to supply energy to the public within the area of supply of the Licensee or some part thereof and includes the Maharashtra State Electricity Board.

Commencement of License

3. This license shall come into force and have effect upon the day when the notification confirming this license is published in the Bombay

Government Gazette, which date is referred to in this license as "the commencement of this license".

Area of Supply

*4. The area of supply shall be the whole of the area described in Part I of the First Annexure, which said area is more particularly delineated upon the deposited map and thereon shown as bounded by a blue coloured line, but excluding therefrom every cantonment, fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, building or other place in the occupation of the Government of India or Bombay for Naval or Military purposes, situate within or partly within such area.

***With effect from the 1st July 1980 the Licensees shall transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board (M.S.E.B.) the distribution rights and also transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board the assets pertaining thereto as set out in Part II of the First Annexure. With a view to arriving at a mutually acceptable agreement in good time, the Licensees shall on or before the 1st July 1984 commence discussions with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board for delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights under this licence which is to be effective from the 1st July 1985, in respect of the Licensees' area of supply now covered by the licence in favour of Bombay Suburban Electric Supply, Limited (B.S.E.S.). In such discussions the guiding principle shall be that the Licensees will be allowed to retain such distribution rights and loads in the said area as may be warranted by surplus generating capacity of the Licensees after meeting the requirements in the area served by Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking ("B.E.S.T.") as well as the Licensee's bulk supplies to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board at various points. In the event of the Licensees and Maharashtra State Electricity Board failing to reach any agreement on the aforesaid issue of such delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights by the 31st December 1984, the State Government shall be entitled to decide the said issue/s and to amend this Licence as the State Government may in its absolute discretion think fit.

**Purposes of supply

5. (I) Subject to the provisions of this license, of the Act, of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, and of the Rules thereunder, energy shall be supplied under this license for all purposes including supply to other licensees for their own purposes and in bulk: Provided that the licensees shall not be under obligation to supply energy in bulk to other licensees "**** other than the Maharashtra State Electricity Board (M.S.E.B.)" for the purpose of enabling such other licensees to supply any consumer whose maximum demand exceeds 250 KVA, except that in the case of the undermentioned other licensees the maximum demand limit shall be:

1,000 KVA for a consumer in the area of supply of the Bombay
Suburban Electric Supply Company Limited

*In respect of the consumers of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, shall draw power at 22 KV from the receiving stations of the Licensees to the extent of the transformation capacities of the said receiving stations.

These demand limits shall, in the case of a factory, be the total requirements of the consumer, estimated on the basis of plant and machinery to be installed in his factory premises for meeting his full production schedule as envisaged in his industrial license at the time he begins operation and not on the basis of the load at which he begins to operate, nor on the basis of future expansion which may result in amendments to his industrial license.

These limits are open to amendment by the Government, when circumstances so warrant, generally or individually in respect of the above-mentioned other licensees in consultation with the Licensees, and the amendments so made shall be notified by Government in the Government Gazette. The Licensees may, however, with the written consent of the Government supply energy in bulk to the other licensees mentioned above for enabling them to supply any person whose demand exceeds the limit specified above or as amended and so notified in the Gazette.

(II) The energy supplied under this license to any consumer for power may be used by such consumer for lighting his premises provided that the energy used by such consumer for such lighting purposes shall not in any year exceed twenty per centum of the total amount of energy supplied to such consumer.

(III) In the event of any difference or dispute arising between the Licensees and other licensees by reason of any objection by the other licensees raised in any case of supply made by the Licensees under sub-clause (I) of this clause, or in regard to the interpretation of the terms of any part of sub-clause (I) of this clause, such dispute shall be referred to an arbitrator appointed by the Government on the application of either party and the decision of such arbitrator shall be final.

Works and System of Supply

6. The systems which may be adopted for the supply of electrical energy under this license are the following:—

- (I) (a) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between the adjacent conductors of a three wire system. the intermediate conductor being connected to earth at the transforming station but insulated at all other parts.
- (b) A continuous current direct supply at pressure not exceeding 250 volts between the conductors of a two wire system.
- (c) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 600 volts for power purposes where the approval of the Government is given.

- (II) (a) A low pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between phases at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second.

- (b) A high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 3,000 volts and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second for power purposes where the approval of the Government is given.
- (III) An extra high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 22,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second. The neutral point of the transformers may, with the approval of the Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority, be connected to earth.
- (IV) Extra high pressure alternating current three phase aerial transmission lines at a pressure not exceeding 1,10,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second for connecting the Generating Station outside the area of supply mentioned in Clause 12 with the Receiving Station or Receiving Stations to be situated within such area. The neutral point of the Generators may, with the approval of the Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority, be connected to earth.

*Provided that the Licensees may with the prior permission in writing of the Government suitably connect its 500 MW Power Station at Trombay to the 220 KV switchyard of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board at Trombay.

Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Government from time to time to issue regulations dealing with the above systems, or, to authorise other systems to be adopted for the purposes of this license. The mains and distributing mains and service lines within the area of supply shall either be underground or aerial lines, provided always that nothing in this license shall be deemed to empower the Licensees to place aerial lines (including the aerial lines mentioned in sub-clause IV of this Clause) along or across any street unless and until the Government, after consulting the local authority, has communicated to the Licensees a general approval in writing of the position and methods of construction of such lines. The aerial transmission lines described in sub-clause (IV) of this Clause shall, in so far as the same will be within the area of supply, be placed according to the alignment indicated by the blue line on the deposited map, and shall be erected, constructed and maintained by the Licensees in strict conformity with the rules in that behalf for the time being in force under the Act.

The Licensees shall at their own cost erect and maintain sufficient guard wires at all places where any wires or mains of the Licensees shall be placed so as to cross above or be liable to fall upon or be blown on to the electric conductors of any Tramway.

Power to break up Private Streets, Railways and Tramways

8. The Licensees are hereby specially authorised within the City of Bombay as defined in the First Annexure to open or break up the streets wholly or partially repairable otherwise than by the Government or by a local authority which are mentioned in Part II of the Second Annexure to this license, and also the railways and tramways which are mentioned in Part III of the said annexure, so far only as concerns level crossings and parts of the railways or tramways running along the highway on the level. The Notices required to be served upon or given to the repairing authority by the Licensees under Section 13 of the Act shall be likewise served upon or given to the Municipal Commissioner for the City of Bombay in relation to the execution of works in any street or part of a street mentioned in Part II of the Second Annexure and such of the other provisions of the said section as are applicable thereto shall apply as if the said commissioner as well as the repairing authority were the person responsible for the repair of such street or part of a street.

Provision in respect of Streets on Port Trust Land

9. When the soil of any street in the area of supply is vested in the Trustees of the Port of Bombay, but such Trustees are not the authority responsible for the repair of such street as referred to in Section 13 of the Act, the Licensees shall nevertheless serve upon the said Trustees, as well as upon the proper repairing authority, the notice required by the said Section 13, previous to the execution of any works involving the placing of any works in, under, over, along or across such street and the provisions of the said Section 13 shall apply as if the said Trustees were also the authority responsible for the repair of such street.

Protection for Existing Tramways of the Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Company, Limited

10. Where the exercise of the powers of the Licensees will involve the placing of any works alongside any rail or any then existing tramway of the Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Company, Limited, the provisions of Sections 14, 15 and 16 of the Act shall with any necessary modifications apply and have effect as if such works were placed over or under such tramway.

Period of Notice to Telegraph Authority

11. The period of notice to be given in writing by the Licensees to the Telegraph Authority under Section 17(i) of the Act before laying down or placing within ten yards of any part of any telegraph line, any electric supply line or other works (except as in the said Section mentioned) shall be not less than fourteen days.

Transmission Line from Generating Station

12. For the purpose of conveying and transmitting energy to any ~~place in the area of supply the Licensees may after an order in writing~~ has been made by the Governor-General in Council conferring upon them such (if any) of the powers referred to in Section 51 of the Act as may be necessary, and upon obtaining from the Government the general approval required by Section 18 of the Act, place aerial transmission lines from a Generating Station constructed or to be constructed near Bhivpuri in the Karjat Taluka of the Kolaba Collectorate, to and up to a Receiving Station, to be constructed upon a site at Dharavi within the area of supply already approved by the Government and from such Receiving Station

to any place included in the area of supply and for that purpose to lay down and place across any intervening area not included in the area of supply any electric supply lines or aerial transmission lines. The aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply from the said Generating Station to and up to the said Receiving Station shall be placed according to the alignment indicated by the blue line on the deposited map or such other alignment as shall be required or previously approved by the Government. All other electric supply lines or aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply shall be laid down or placed on such alignment or alignments as shall be required or previously approved by the Government.

The Licensees are also authorised for the purposes of this clause to cross the navigable creeks and arms of the sea specified in the Fourth Annexure to this license.

****Maximum Charges**

13. The prices to be charged by the Licensees for energy supplied by them to their consumers shall be regulated by the requirements of the Sixth Schedule and the other applicable provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, or of any other enactment for the time being in force, in amendment or in substitution thereof.

****Purchase of Undertaking**

14. The option of purchase, given by Section 6 of the Act, shall be exercisable first on the expiry of the period ending on the 15th August 2014 (Government having already agreed with the Licensees to waive the exercise of the earlier options for the purchase of such undertaking, the last of which expires on the 15th August 2004 and if not so exercised, then at the end of every subsequent period of ten years during the subsistence of this Licence. In that event, the amount payable for all lands, buildings, works, materials and plants of the Licensees shall be the value determined in accordance with the provisions of law in force at the time of such purchase, and there shall be added to such value so computed as aforesaid, on account of compulsory purchase, such solatium as may be payable under the law applicable in the State for the time being. In case of such law providing for such solatium to be based on the provisions in the Licence, the Licensees shall be entitled to the ten per cent solatium. Provided that, for the purpose of purchase of the Undertaking covered by this licence, no part or parts of the Undertaking covered by any separate licence granted by Government for a thermal station to the same Licensees shall be taken into consideration.

***Exclusion from License of certain clauses in Schedule to Act**

15. The provisions contained in clauses IV, V, VII, VIII and XII of the Schedule to the Act shall be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license; and the other provisions contained in the said Schedule shall also be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license insofar as they are inconsistent with its terms. ~~Clause VI~~ shall also be excepted in respect of consumers referred to in clause 5(1) of this license making a demand less than the limits specified therein.

Limits of Licensees' Obligation to Supply Energy

16. The Licensees shall not be under any obligation, under Section 22 or Section 23 of the Act, to supply more energy than is consistent with their obligation to maintain a constant supply to consumers, due regard being had to the capacity of the Licensees' water-storage; but, in addition, they may supply to consumers willing to take energy on condition of a surplus being available.

Assignment of the License

*17. At any time after the commencement of this license, the licensee may, with the previous consent in writing of Government, assign this License and transfer the whole of the undertaking in respect of which this License is granted (including all lands, buildings, works, materials and plant of the licensee) to any individual or body to be formed and registered in accordance with law for the time being in force or a body established or which may be established by any law or enactment for the time being in force in India.

**Security Deposit

18. The extent of the State Government's participation in financing the 500 MW Trombay project shall not exceed Rs. 25 crores, of which Rs. 15 crores will be raised by the Licensees by collecting security deposits in cash from their existing consumers which shall notionally be treated as the contribution of the State Government. The balance contribution of the State Government shall be limited to Rs. 10 crores which shall be suitably deferred to a date as required by the State Government. The composition of the above contribution in terms of loan and equity shall be decided by the State Government at a later date.

This arrangement shall be subject to such revision as may be agreed to between the Licensees and the State Government.

The Licensees shall take immediate steps to collect security deposits in cash from all their consumers excluding other Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, in a phased manner to reduce the burden on consumers.

The entire amount of security deposits as collected by the Licensees as stated above shall be treated as part of Government's Contribution for the financing of the said project.

FIRST ANNEXURE

PART I

***Area of Supply**

(1) The area contained within the limits of the City of Bombay as defined by Section 3(10) of the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1904.

(2) The whole of that portion of the Island of Salsette, as is bounded on the South by the Town and Island of Bombay and on the North by the Bassein and Thane Creeks.

(3) The area contained within a circle of eight miles radius round the Licensee's sub-station at Kalyan but excluding therefrom the area west of the centre line of the crest of the Parsik range of hills.

(4) The area contained within the limits of the Municipal Borough of Lonavla in Poona District.

(5) The area contained within the Municipal limits of Panvel in Kolaba District.

****PART II***Rationalisation of Distribution*

(Effective 1st July 1980)

(1) The Licensees will transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, the Licensees', existing and future consumers', distribution rights, the Licensees, sub-stations, supply facilities and assets at consumers' premises in the following areas :

(i) Panvel Licence area.

(ii) Bhiwandi Licence area.

(iii) Lonavla-Khandala Licence area excluding 22/6.6 KV distribution lines from Khopoli which serve the Licensees head-works.

(iv) Bassein Licence area.

The Licensee will continue to supply power at 100/22/6.6 KV at the above sub-stations/points of supply, as the case may be, for a mutually agreed period to enable the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to make its own arrangements.

(2) The Licensee will surrender their distribution rights in Kalyan and Ambernath areas except for the right of bulk supply to:—

(i) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board; and

- (ii) Ordnance Factory at Ambernath at 100 KV. The Licensees will retain all their present assets in these areas except the outgoing 22 KV lines from Kalyan and Ambernath Receiving Station and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers sub-stations.

(3) The Licensee will surrender their distribution rights in Kolshet area served by their 22 KV distribution system excepting for the right of bulk supply to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. The Licensees will retain all their present assets in this area excepting the outgoing 22 KV feeders from their Kolshet Receiving Station and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers sub-stations.

(4) The Licensees are agreeable to permit the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to take over all their present and future direct consumers in the erstwhile Thane Electric Supply Company Licence area. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall receive power from the Licensee, Salsette and Kolshet Receiving Stations at 22 KV. The Licensees will retain all their assets in these areas excepting the outgoing feeders and the terminal equipment at the consumers' end. In addition, the Licensees will retain the following consumers and feeders :

(i) Bombay Municipal Corporation (BMC) at 100 KV.

(ii) The Licensees' feeders from the Salsette Receiving Station supplying to the B.S.E.S. area.

(5) The capacities of the Licensee's transformers at Ambernath, Kalyan and Kolshet 100/22 KV Receiving Stations will be frozen by the Licensees as on the 30th June 1980, unless otherwise mutually agreed to augment the capacity further. The Licensees shall have the right to supply and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall draw power at 22 KV from these Receiving Stations to the extent of transformation capacity already set up by that time. The transformation capacity is understood to mean capacities of all transformers in service and those under installation and required to be installed upto the 30th June 1980.

(6) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board will have the right to bring in its own Transmission Lines and set up its own Receiving Stations, in the entire area of the Licensees excluding the area currently served by the B.E.S.T. and the B.S.E.S. at any date after the 30th June 1980. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board may take such advance action as may be necessary for the purpose and keep the Licensees informed suitably. The Licensees shall offer all co-operation and accommodation in allowing crossing of their lines by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board's lines. When the Maharashtra State Electricity Board creates such facilities it will be ensured that loads supplied at that time by the Licensees from their Receiving Stations in the areas handed over are not reduced except for marginal adjustments.

(7) The transfer of assets on rationalisation of distribution shall be on the basis of the provisions of Clause 14 of this Licence.

(8) If the Government is satisfied that it has not been possible for the Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to reach agreement on any point or points mentioned in this part or the Licensee has not been giving to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board adequate co-

operation and accommodation as required under any of the above provisions in this part, it will be competent to the Government to issue to the Licensees such directions as the Government may in its absolute discretion think necessary for the purpose and thereupon the Licensees shall be under an obligation to abide by the same.

LICENSE granted by the Government of Bombay under the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, in respect of the Town and Island of Bombay, and of such other areas as may be notified in the Government Gazette extending the license thereto from time to time to THE TATA POWER COMPANY, LIMITED, a Company registered under the Indian Companies Act, 1913, and having its Registered Office at Navsari Buildings, Hornby Road, Fort, Bombay, for the supply of Electrical Energy in the areas, with the powers and upon the terms and conditions all specified below.

SHORT TITLE

1. This license may be cited as "The Nila Mula Valley (Hydro-Electric) License, 1921".

INTERPRETATION

2. The several words, terms and expressions to which by the Indian Electricity Act, 1910 or by the Rules thereunder, meanings are assigned shall have in this license the same respective meanings provided that in this License:—

- (1) The expression "the Act" shall mean the Indian Electricity Act, 1910.
- (2) The expression "the Government" shall mean the Government of Bombay.
- (3) The expression "the Licensees" shall mean and include The Tata Power Company, Limited and its permitted assigns.
- (4) The expression "First Annexure," "Second Annexure," "Third Annexure," and "Fourth Annexure," shall mean the the first, second, third and fourth annexures to this license, respectively.
- *(5) The expression deposited map shall mean the plan or map which is signed for purposes of identification by the Secretary (Energy) to the Government of Maharashtra in the Industries, Energy and Labour Department and Managing Director of the Licensees, and which has been deposited with the Government of Maharashtra by the Licensees in pursuance of the Rules under the Act and which shows the area of supply hereinafter specified.
- ** (6) The expression "other licensees" shall mean any person or persons (other than the Licensee) who are duly authorised by a license for the time being in force under the Act to supply energy to the public within the area of supply of the Licensee or some part thereof and includes the Maharashtra State Electricity Board.

COMMENCEMENT OF LICENSE

3. This license shall come into force and have effect upon the day when the notification confirming this license is published in the Bombay Government Gazette, which date is referred to in this license as "the commencement of this license."

AREA OF SUPPLY

*4. The area of supply shall be the whole of the area described in Part I of the First Annexure, which said area is more particularly delineated upon the deposited map and thereon shown as bounded by a blue coloured line, but excluding therefrom every cantonment, fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, building or other place in the occupation of the Government of India or Bombay for Naval or Military purposes, situate within or partly within such area.

***With effect from the 1st July 1980 the Licensee shall transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board (the M.S.E.B.), the distribution rights and also transfer to the M.S.E.B. the assets pertaining thereto as set out in Part II of the First Annexure.

With a view to arriving at a mutually acceptable agreement in good time, the Licensees shall on or before the 1st July 1984, commence discussions with the M.S.E.B. for delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights under this licence which is to be effective from the 1st July 1985 in respect of the Licensees area of supply now covered by the licence in favour of Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Limited (B.S.E.S.). In such discussions the guiding principle shall be that the Licensees will be allowed to retain such distribution rights and loads in the said area as may be warranted by surplus generating capacity of the Licensees after meeting the requirements in the area served by Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking (B.E.S.T.), as well as the Licensees' bulk supplies to the M.S.E.B. at various points. In the event of the Licensees' and the M.S.E.B. failing to reach any agreement on the aforesaid issue of such delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights by the 31st December 1984, the State Government shall be entitled to decide the said issues and to amend this Licence as the State Government may in its absolute discretion think fit.

*PURPOSES OF SUPPLY

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this license, of the Act, of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, and of the Rules thereunder, energy shall be supplied under this license for all purposes including supply to other licensees for their own purposes and in bulk: Provided that the licensees shall not be under obligation to supply energy in bulk to other licensees ***other than the M.S.E.B., for the purpose of enabling such other licensees to supply any consumer whose maximum demand exceeds 250 KVA, except that in the case of the undermentioned other licensees the maximum demand limit shall be:

1,000 KVA for a consumer in the area of supply of the Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Company Limited.

**In respect of the consumers of M.S.E.B., the M.S.E.B. shall draw power at 22 KV from the receiving stations of the Licensees to the extent of the transformation capacities of the said receiving stations.

These demand limits shall, in the case of a factory, be the total requirements of the consumer, estimated on the basis of plant and machinery to be installed in his factory premises for meeting his full production schedule as envisaged in his industrial license at the time he begins operation and not on the basis of the load at which he begins to operate, nor on the basis of future expansion which may result in amendments to his industrial license. These limits are open to amendment by the Government, when circumstances so warrant, generally or individually in respect of the above-mentioned other licensees in consultation with the Licensees, and the amendments so made shall be notified by Government in the Government Gazette. The Licensees may, however, with the written consent of the Government supply energy in bulk to the other licensees mentioned above for enabling them to supply any person whose demand exceeds the limit specified above or as amended and so notified in the Gazette.

- (II) The energy supplied under this license to any consumer for power may be used by such consumer for lighting his premises provided that the energy used by such consumer for such lighting purposes shall not in any year exceed twenty per centum of the total amount of energy supplied to such consumer.
- (III) In the event of any difference or dispute arising between the Licensees and other Licensees by reason of any objection by the other Licensees raised in any case of supply made by the Licensees under sub-clause (I) of this clause, or in regard to the interpretation of the terms of any part of sub-clause (I) of this clause, such dispute shall be referred to an arbitrator appointed by the Government on the application of either party and the decision of such arbitrator shall be final.

WORKS AND SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

6. The systems which may be adopted for the supply of electrical energy under this license are the following :—

- (I) (a) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between the adjacent conductors of a three-wire system, the intermediate conductor being ~~connected to earth at the transforming station but insulated at all other parts.~~
- (b) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between the conductors of a two-wire system.

- (c) A continuous current direct supply at a pressure not exceeding 600 volts for power purposes where the approval of the Government is given.
- (II) (a) A low pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 250 volts between phases at frequency of 50 complete periods per second.
- (b) A high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 3,000 volts and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second for power purposes where the approval of the Government is given.
- (III) An extra high pressure alternating current three-phase supply at a pressure not exceeding 22,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second. The neutral point of the transformers may, with the approval of the Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority, be connected to earth.
- (IV) Extra high pressure alternating current three-phase aerial transmission lines at a pressure not exceeding 110,000 volts between phases and at a frequency of 50 complete periods per second for connecting the Generating Station outside the area of supply mentioned in Clause 12 with Receiving Station or Receiving Stations to be situated within such area. The neutral point of the Generators may with the approval of the Government and the concurrence of the Telegraph Authority be connected to earth.

*Provided that the Licensee may with the prior permission in writing of the Government suitably connect is 500 MW Power Station at Trombay to the 220 KV switchyard of M.S.E.B. at Trombay.

Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Government from time to time to issue regulations dealing with the above systems, or, to authorise other systems to be adopted for the purposes of this license. The mains and distributing mains and service lines within the area of supply shall either be underground or aerial lines, provided always that nothing in this license shall be deemed to empower the Licensees to place aerial lines (including the aerial lines mentioned in sub-clause IV of this Clause) along or across any street unless and until the Government, after consulting the local authority, has communicated to the Licensees a general approval in writing of the position and methods of construction of such lines. The aerial transmission lines described in sub-clause (IV) of the Clause shall, in so far as the same will be within the area of supply, be placed according to the alignment indicated by the red line on the deposited map, and shall be erected, constructed and maintained by the Licensees in strict conformity with the rules in that behalf for the time being in force under the Act.

The Licensees shall at their own cost erect and maintain sufficient guard wires at all places where any wires or mains of the Licensees shall be placed so as to cross above or be liable to fall upon or be blown on to the electric conductors of any Tramway, and when any such wires or mains cross above or are liable to fall upon or be blown on to any

telegraph or telephone wire or wires the Licensees shall at their own cost erect and maintain sufficient guard wires or take such other precautions as the Director of Telegraph Engineering shall approve.

No works shall be erected by the Licensees on or near any fortified area or Military lands in Bombay without the previous written consent of the General Officer Commanding, Bombay District.

LIST OF STREETS TO BE CROSSED OUTSIDE THE AREA OF SUPPLY

7. A list of the streets outside the area of supply along or across which electric supply lines are to be laid or placed is contained in Part I of the Second Annexure to this license.

POWER TO BREAK UP PRIVATE STREETS, RAILWAYS AND TRAMWAYS

8. The Licensees are hereby specially authorised within the City of Bombay as defined in the First Annexure to open or break up the streets wholly or partially repairable otherwise than by the Government or by local authority which are mentioned in Part II of the Second Annexure to this license, and also the railways and tramways which are mentioned in Part III of the said annexure, so far only as concerns level crossings and parts of the railways or tramways running along the highway on the level. The Notices required to be served upon or given to the repairing authority by the Licensees under Section 13 of the Act shall be likewise served upon or given to the Municipal Commissioner for the City of Bombay in relation to the execution of works in any street or part of a street mentioned in Part II of the Second Annexure and such of the other provisions of the said section as are applicable thereto shall apply as if the said Commissioner as well as the repairing authority were the person responsible for the repair of such street or part of a street.

PROVISION IN RESPECT OF STREETS ON PORT TRUST LAND

9. When the soil of any street in the area of supply is vested in Trustees of the Port of Bombay, but such Trustees are not the authority responsible for the repair of such street as referred to in Section 13 of the Act, the Licensees shall nevertheless serve upon the said Trustees, as well as upon the proper repairing authority, the notice required by the said Section 13, previous to the execution of any works involving the placing of any works in, under, over, along or across such street and the provisions of the said Section 13 shall apply as if the said Trustee were also the authority responsible for the repair of such street.

PROTECTION FOR EXISTING TRAMWAYS OF THE BOMBAY ELECTRIC SUPPLY AND TRAMWAYS COMPANY, LIMITED

10. Where the exercise of the powers of the Licensees will involve the placing of any works alongside any rail of any then existing tramway of the Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Company, Limited, the provisions of Sections 14, 15 and 16 of the Act shall with any necessary modifications apply and have effect as if such works were placed over or under such tramway.

PERIOD OF NOTICE TO TELEGRAPH AUTHORITY

11. The period of notice to be given in writing by the Licensees to the Telegraph Authority under Section 17(i) of the Act before laying down or placing within ten yards of any part of any telegraph line, any electric supply-line or other works (except as in the said Section mentioned) shall be not less than fourteen days.

TRANSMISSION LINE FROM GENERATING STATION

12. For the purpose of conveying and transmitting energy to any place in the area of supply the Licensees may after an order in writing has been made by the Governor-General in Council conferring upon them such (if any) of the powers referred to in Section 51 of the Act as may be necessary, and upon obtaining from the Government the general approval required by Section 18 of the Act, place aerial transmission lines from a Generating Station constructed or to be constructed near Bhira in the Mangan Taluka of the Kolaba Collectorate, to and up to a Receiving Station, to be constructed upon a site at Dharavi within the area of supply approved by the Government and from such Receiving Station to any place included in the area of supply and for that purpose to lay down and place across any intervening area not included in the area of supply any electric supply lines or aerial transmission lines. The aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply from the said Generating Station to and up to the said Receiving Station shall be placed according to the alignment indicated by the red line on the deposited map or such other alignment as shall be required or previously approved by the Government. All other electric supply lines or aerial transmission lines outside the area of supply shall be laid down or placed on such alignment or alignments as shall be required or previously approved by the Government.

The Licensees are also authorised for the purposes of this clause to cross the navigable creeks and arms of the sea specified in the Fourth Annexure to this license.

****MAXIMUM CHARGES**

13. The prices to be charged by the Licensee for energy supplied by them to their consumers shall be regulated by the requirements of the Sixth Schedule and the other applicable provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, or of any other enactment for the time being in force, in amendment or in substitution thereof.

****PURCHASE OF UNDERTAKING**

14. The option of purchase, given by section 6 of the Act, shall be exercisable first on the expiry of the period ending on the 15th August 2014 (Government having already agreed with the Licensees to waive the exercise of the earlier options for the purchase of such undertaking, the last of which expires on the 15th August, 2004), and if not so exercised, then at the end of every subsequent period of ten years during the subsistence of this Licence. In that event, the amount payable for all lands, buildings, works, materials and plants of the Licensee shall be the value determined in accordance with the provisions of law in force at the time of such purchase, and there shall be added to such value so computed as aforesaid, on account of compulsory purchase, such solatium as may be payable under the law applicable in the State for the time being. In case of such law providing for such solatium to be based on the provisions in the Licence, the Licensees shall be entitled to ten per cent, solatium:

Provided that, for the purpose of purchase of the Undertaking ~~covered by this Licence no part or parts of the Undertaking covered by~~ any separate licence granted by Government for a thermal station to the same Licensees shall be taken into consideration.

****EXCLUSION FROM LICENSE OF CERTAIN CLAUSES IN SCHEDULE TO ACT**

15. The provisions contained in Clauses IV, V, VII, VIII and XII of the Schedule to the Act shall be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license; and the other provisions contained in the said Schedule shall also be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license insofar as they are inconsistent with its terms. Clause VI shall also be excepted in respect of consumers referred to in Clause 5(1) of this license making a demand less than the limits specified therein.

16. The Licensees shall not be under any obligation, under Section 22 or Section 23 of the Act to supply more energy than is consistent with their obligation to maintain a constant supply to consumers, due regard being had to the capacity of the Licensees' water-storage, but, in addition, they may supply to consumers willing to take energy on condition of surplus being available.

LICENSE REVOCABLE ON BREACH OF CERTAIN TERMS, ETC.

17. This License is granted upon the condition that the Licensees will perform, observe and comply with all the terms and conditions of the Agreement dated the 20th day of May 1921 and made between the Licensees of the one part and the Secretary of State for India in Council of the other part and especially Clauses 7, 8 and 9 of that Agreement and any failure on the part of the Licensees in that behalf or breach by the Licensees of any of such terms or conditions will render this License liable to revocation.

***SECURITY DEPOSIT**

18. The extent of the State Government's participation in financing the 500 MW Trombay project shall not exceed Rs. 25 crores, of which Rs. 15 crores will be raised by the Licensees by collecting security deposits in cash from their existing consumers which shall notionally be treated as the contribution of the State Government. The balance contribution of the State Government shall be limited to Rs. 10 crores which shall be suitably deferred to a date as required by the State Government. The composition of the above contribution in terms of loan and equity shall be decided by the State Government at a later date. This arrangement shall be subject to such revision as may be agreed to between the Licensees and the State Government.

The Licensees shall take immediate steps to collect security deposits in cash from all their consumers excluding other Licensees and the M.S.E.B. in a phased manner to reduce the burden on consumers.

The entire amount of security deposits as collected by the Licensees as stated above shall be treated as part of Government's contribution for the financing of the said project.

****FIRST ANNEXURE****PART I****AREA OF SUPPLY**

(1) The area contained within the limits of the City of Bombay as defined by Section 3(10) of the Bombay General Clauses Act, 1904.

(2) The whole of that portion of the Island of Salsette, as is bounded on the South by the Town and Island of Bombay and on the North by the Bassein and Thana Creeks.

(3) The area contained within a circle of eight miles radius round the Licensee's sub-station at Kalyan but excluding therefrom the area west of the centre line of the crest of the Parsik range of hills.

(4) The area contained within the limits of the Municipal Borough of Lonavla in Poona District.

(5) The area contained within the Municipal limits of Panvel in Kolaba District.

PART II*RATIONALISATION OF DISTRIBUTION**

(Effective 1st July 1980)

(1) The Licensee will transfer to the M.S.E.B. the Licensee's existing and future consumers, distribution rights, the Licensee's sub-stations, supply facilities and assets at consumers' premises in the following areas:—

(i) Panvel Licence area.

(ii) Bhiwandi Licence area.

(iii) Lonavla-Khandala Licence area excluding 22/6.6 KV distribution lines from Khopoli which serve the Licensees' head works.

(iv) Bassein Licence area.

The Licensee will continue to supply power at 100/22/6.6 KV at the above sub-stations/points of supply, as the case may be, for a mutually agreed period to enable M.S.E.B. to make its own arrangements.

(2) The Licensee will surrender their distribution rights in Kalyan and Ambernath areas except for the right of bulk supply to:—

(i) M.S.E.B., and

(ii) Ordnance Factory at Ambernath at 100 KV.

The Licensee will retain all their present assets in these areas except the outgoing 22 KV lines from Kalyan and Ambernath Receiving Stations and the Licensee's terminal equipment at the consumers' sub-stations.

(3) The Licensees will surrender their distribution rights in Kolshet area served by their 22 KV distribution system excepting for the right of bulk supply to the M.S.E.B. The Licensee will retain all their present assets in this area excepting the outgoing 22 KV feeders from their Kolshet Receiving Station and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers' sub-stations.

(4) The Licensees are agreeable to permit the M.S.E.B. to take over all their present and future direct consumers in the erstwhile Thana Electric Supply Company Licence area. The M.S.E.B. shall receive power from the Licensees' Salsette and Kolshet Receiving Stations at 22 KV. The Licensees will retain all their assets in these areas excepting the outgoing feeders and the terminal equipment at the consumers' end. In addition, the Licensees will retain the following consumers and feeders :—

(i) Bombay Municipal Corporation (BMC) at 100 KV.

(ii) The Licensees' feeders from the Salsette Receiving Station supplying to the B.S.E.S. area.

(5) The capacities of the Licensee's transformers at Ambernath, Kalyan and Kolshet 100/22 KV Receiving Stations will be frozen by the Licensees as on the 30th June 1980, unless otherwise mutually agreed to augment the capacity further. The Licensee shall have the right to supply and the M.S.E.B. shall draw power at 22 KV from these Receiving Stations to the extent of transformation capacity already set-up by that time. The transformation capacity is understood to mean capacities of all transformers in service and those under installation and required to be installed upon the 30th June 1980.

(6) The M.S.E.B. will have the right to bring in its own Transmission Lines and set-up its own Receiving Stations, in the entire area of the Licensee excluding the area currently served by B.E.S.T. and the B.S.E.S. at any date after the 30 June 1980. The M.S.E.B. may take such advance action as may be necessary for the purpose and keep the Licensees informed suitably. The Licensee shall offer all co-operation and accommodation in allowing crossing of their lines by the M.S.E.B.'s lines.

When the M.S.E.B. creates such facilities it will be ensured that loads supplied at that time by the Licensee from their Receiving Stations in the areas handed over are not reduced except for marginal adjustments.

(7) The transfer of assets on rationalisation of distribution shall be on the basis of the provisions of clause 14 of this Licence.

(8) If the Government is satisfied that it has not been possible for the Licensees and Maharashtra State Electricity Board to reach agreement on any point or points mentioned in this part or the Licensee has not been giving to Maharashtra State Electricity Board adequate co-operation and accommodation as required under any of the above provisions in this part, it will be competent to the Government to issue to the Licensee such directions as the Government may in its absolute discretion think necessary for the purpose and thereupon the Licensees shall be under an obligation to abide by the same.

License is hereby granted by the Government of Bombay under the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, to the Tata Hydro-Electric Power Supply Company, Limited, the Andhra Valley Power Supply Company, Limited, and the Tata Power Company, Limited, being Companies registered under the Indian Companies, Act and having their respective Registered Offices at Bombay House, Bruce Street, Fort, Bombay, and already holding the undermentioned licenses under the said Act, namely "The Bombay (Hydro-Electric) License, 1907", "The Andhra Valley (Hydro-Electric) License, 1919", and "The Nila Mula Valley (Hydro-Electric) License, 1921", respectively, (as amended), to generate electrical energy by fuel burning plant and to supply such electrical energy in the areas, with the powers and upon the terms and conditions as specified below.

1. This license may be cited as "The Trombay Thermal Power Electric License, 1953". Short Title.

2. The several words, terms and expressions to which by the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, or by the Rules made thereunder, meanings are assigned shall have in this license the same respective meanings provided that in this license :— Interpretation.

- (i) The expression "the Act" shall mean the Indian Electricity Act, 1910.
- (ii) The expression "the Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Bombay.
- (iii) The expression "the Licensees" shall mean the Tata Hydro-Electric Power Supply Company, Limited, the Andhra Valley Power Supply Company, Limited, and the Tata Power Company, Limited, or any one or more of them and its and their permitted assigns.
- (iv) The expression "First Annexure", "Second Annexure" and "Third Annexure" shall mean the First, Second and Third Annexures to this license respectively.

*(v) The expression "deposited map" shall mean the plan or map which is signed for purposes of identification by the Secretary (Energy) to the Government of Maharashtra in the Industries, Energy and Labour Department and Managing Director of the Licensees, and which has been deposited with the Government of Maharashtra by the Licensees in pursuance of the Rules under the Act and which shows the area of supply hereinafter specified.

*(vi) The expression "other licensees" shall mean any person or persons (other than the Licensees) who are duly authorised by a license for the time being in force under the Act to supply energy to the public within the area of supply of the Licensee or some part thereof and includes the Maharashtra State Electricity Board.

Commencement
of license.

3. This license shall come into force and have effect upon the day when the notification confirming this license is published in the Bombay Government Gazette, which date is referred to in this license as "the commencement of this license".

Area of Supply.

***4. The area of supply shall be the whole of the area described in Part I of the First Annexure, which said area is more particularly delineated upon the deposited map and thereon shown as bounded by a blue coloured line, but excluding therefrom every cantonment, fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, building or other place in the occupation of the Government of India or Bombay for naval or military purposes, situated within or partly within such area.

***With effect from 1st July 1980 the Licensees shall transfer to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board (M.S.E.B.), the distribution rights and also transfer to the M.S.E.B., the assets pertaining thereto as set out in Part-II of the First Annexure.

***With a view to arriving at a mutually acceptable agreement in good time, the Licensees shall on or before the 1st July 1984 commence discussions with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board for delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights under this licence which is to be effective from the 1st July 1985, in respect of the Licensees'

area of supply now covered by the licence in favour of Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Company Limited. (B.S.E.S.). In such discussions the guiding principle shall be that the Licensees will be allowed to retain such distribution rights and loads in the said Area as may be warranted by surplus generating capacity of the Licensees after meeting the requirements in the area served by Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking (B.E.S.T.), as well as the Licensees' bulk supplies to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, at various points. In the event of the Licensees and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, failing to reach any agreement on the aforesaid issue of such delimitation of the area of supply and distribution and other rights by the 31st December 1984, the State Government shall be entitled to decide the said issue and to amend this Licence as the State Government may in its absolute discretion think fit.

*5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this license, of the Act, of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, and of the Rules thereunder, energy shall be supplied under this license for all purposes including supply to other licensees for their own purposes and in bulk : Provided that the licensees shall not be under obligation to supply energy in bulk to other licensees **other than the Maharashtra State Electricity Board for the purpose of enabling such other licensees to supply any consumer whose maximum demand exceeds 250KVA, except that in the case of the undermentioned other licensees the maximum demand limit shall be :

Purposes of Supply.

1,000 KVA for a consumer in the area of supply of the Bombay Suburban Electric Supply Company Limited.

In respect of the consumers of the *Maharashtra State Electricity Board, the Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall draw power at 22 KV from the receiving stations of the Licensees to the extent of the transformation capacities of the said receiving stations.

These demand limits shall, in the case of a factory, be the total ~~requirements of the consumer, estimated on the basis of plant and machinery~~ to be installed in his factory premises for meeting his full

production schedule as envisaged in his industrial license at the time he begins operation and not on the basis of the load at which he begins to operate, nor on the basis of future expansion which may result in amendments to his industrial license.

These limits are open to amendment by the Government, when circumstances so warrant, generally or individually in respect of the abovementioned other licensees in consultation with the Licensees, and the amendments so made shall be notified by Government in the Government Gazette. The Licensees may, however, with the written consent of the Government supply energy in bulk to the other licensees mentioned above for enabling them to supply any person whose demand exceeds the limit specified above or as amended and so notified in the Gazette.

(II) The energy supplied under this license to any consumer for power may be used by such consumer for lighting his premises provided that the energy used by such consumer for such lighting purposes shall not in any year exceed twenty per centum of the total amount of energy supplied to such consumer.

(III) In the event of any difference or dispute arising between the Licensees and other Licensees by reason of any objection by the other Licensees raised in any case of supply made by the Licensees under sub-clause (I) of this clause, or in regard to the interpretation of the terms of any part of sub-clause (I) of this clause, such dispute shall be referred to an arbitrator appointed by the Government on the application of either party and the decision of such arbitrator shall be final.

6. (I) The system of supply of energy which may be adopted for the purpose of this license shall be the alternating current, three phase, 50 cycles supply at any pressure upto 110,000 volts :

*Provided that, the Licensees may with the prior permission in writing of the State Government suitably connect its 500 MW Power Station at Trombay to the 220KV switch yard of Maharashtra State Electricity Board at Trombay.

Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Government from time to time to authorise the Licensees to adopt any other system or systems for the purposes of this license.

(II) ~~No works shall be erected by the Licensees on or near any fortified area or military lands in Bombay without the previous written consent of the General Officer Commanding, Bombay Area.~~

7. The Licensees are hereby specially authorised within the City of Bombay as defined in the First Annexure to open or break up the streets wholly or partially repairable otherwise than by the Government by a local authority which are mentioned in Part I of the Second Annexure to this license, and also the railways and tramways which are mentioned in Part II of the said annexure, so far only as concerns level crossing and parts of the railways or tramways running along a highway on the level. The notices required to be served upon or given to the repairing authority by the Licensees under Section 13 of the Act shall be likewise served upon or given to the Municipal Commissioner for the City of Bombay in relation to the execution of works on any street or part of a street mentioned in Part I of the Second Annexure and such of the other provisions of the said section as are applicable thereto shall apply as if the said Commissioner as well as the repairing authority were the persons responsible for the repair of such street or part of a street.

Power to break up Private Streets, Railways and Tramways.

8. When the soil of any street in the area of supply is vested in the Trustees of the Port of Bombay but such Trustees are not the authority responsible for the repair of such street as referred to in Section 13 of the Act, the Licensees shall nevertheless serve upon the said Trustees, as well as upon the proper repairing authority, the notice required by the said Section 13, previous to the execution of any works involving the carrying out of any works in, under, over, along or across such street and the provisions of the said Section 13 shall apply as if the said Trustees were also the authority responsible for the repair of such street.

Provision in respect of Streets on Port Trust Land.

9. Where the exercise of the power of the Licensees will involve the placing of any works alongside any rail or any then existing tramways of the Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking, the provisions of Sections 14, 15 and 16 of the Act shall with any necessary modifications apply and have effect as if such work were placed over or under such tramways.

Protection for the existing Tramways of the Bombay Electric Supply and Transport Undertaking.

10. The period of notice to be given in writing by the Licensees to the Telegraph Authority under Section 17(i) of the Act before laying down or placing within ten yards of any part of any telegraph line, any electric supply line or other works (except as in the said section mentioned) shall be not less than fourteen days.

Period of notice to Telegraph Authority.

**11. The generating station will be within the area of supply and shall be for such maximum capacity as may be accepted by the Government having regard to the requirements of the system.

12. For the purpose of conveying and transmitting energy to any place in the area of supply the Licensees may after an order in writing

has been made conferring upon them such (if any) of the powers referred to in Section 51 of the Act as may be necessary and upon obtaining from the Government the general approval required by Section 18 of the Act, place aerial and underground transmission lines from a Steam Turbo-Generating Station. The transmission lines from the said Generating Station shall be placed according to the alignment indicated by the red line on the deposited map or such other alignment as shall be required or previously approved by the Government.

The Licensees are also authorised for the purposes of this clause to cross the creeks and arms of the sea specified in the Third Annexure to this license.

13. The prices to be charged by the Licensees for energy supplied by them to their consumers shall be regulated by the requirements of the Sixth Schedule and the other applicable provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, or of any other enactment for the time being in force, in amendment or in substitution thereof.

*14. The option of purchase, given by section 6 of the Act, shall be exercisable first on the expiry of the period ending on the 15th August 2014 (Government having already agreed with the Licensees to waive the exercise of the earlier options for the purchase of such undertaking, the last of which expires on the 15th August 2004), and if not so exercised, then at the end of every subsequent period of ten years during the subsistence of this Licence. In that event the amount payable for all lands, buildings, works, materials and plants of the Licensees shall be the value determined in accordance with the provisions of law in force at the time of such purchase, and there shall be added to such value so computed as aforesaid, on account of compulsory purchase, such solatium as may be payable under the law applicable in the State for the time being. In case of such law providing for such solatium to be based on the provisions in the Licence, the Licensees shall be entitled to ten per cent solatium.

It is hereby declared that the Generating Station and Transmission Lines used in connection with the Undertaking shall form part of the Undertaking for the purposes of purchase under Section 7A of the Act :

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limited, the Andhra Valley Power Supply Company, Limited, and the Tata Power Company, Limited, shall be taken into consideration.

*15. The provisions contained in clauses IV, V, VII VIII and XII of the Schedule to the Act shall be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license; and the other provisions contained in the said Schedule shall also be excepted from incorporation with and forming part of this license insofar as they are inconsistent with its terms. Clause VI shall also be excepted in respect of consumers referred to in clause 5(1) of this license making a demand less than the limits specified therein.

Exclusion from the License of certain clauses in Schedule to the Act.

**16. At any time after the commencement of this license, the licensee may, with the previous consent in writing of Government, assign this License and transfer the whole of the undertaking in respect of which this License is granted (including all lands, buildings, works, materials and plant of the licensee) to any individual or body to be formed and registered in accordance with law for the time being in force or a body established or which may be established by any law or enactment for the time being in force in India.

Assignment of the License.

***17. (1) The Licensees shall regulate the operation of their thermal generating units in consultation with the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to enable integrated operation of the generating facilities in the State, taking into account the various changing operating conditions in the interconnected system, which will include such matters as backing down of some of the thermal units in the State during light load periods, equitably as required by the system.

(2) If the Government is of the opinion that for the purpose of securing integrated operation of the generating facilities in the State including the matters referred to in sub-clause (1) above, it is necessary to give any directions to the Licensees for regulation of the operation of their Thermal Generating units, the Government may issue to the Licensees such directions as the Government may in its absolute discretion deem fit and thereupon the Licensees shall be under an obligation to duly comply with the same.

****18. The Licensees shall implement the 500 MW project in accordance with the terms and conditions approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Energy, as detailed in their letter No. 9/1/74/EL-1, dated the

*19. The Licensees shall unless otherwise agreed by Government of Maharashtra, abide by the requirements of the Government of Maharashtra on air and water pollution control as detailed in the Fourth Annexure to this License.

*20. The land developed as a result of dumping of fly-ash shall be kept green and not put to any other use without the prior permission of the Government of Maharashtra.

*21. At all times during the subsistence of this license, the Government of Maharashtra shall be entitled to nominate two persons as Directors one each on the Board of Directors of any two of the Licensees Companies and the Licensees Companies shall appoint such nominees as Directors. Such nominees shall not be bound to hold any shares of the Company of which they are Directors and shall not be liable to retire by rotation. Government of Maharashtra shall be entitled to cancel at any time any such nomination and make a fresh nomination. All the Licensees Companies shall forthwith for the purpose make necessary amendments to their respective Articles of Association after getting the same approved by the Government of Maharashtra.

*22. The extent of the participation of the Government of Maharashtra in financing the 500 MW project shall not exceed Rs. 25 crores, of which Rs. 15 crores will be raised by the Licensees by collecting security deposits in cash from their existing consumers which shall notionally be treated as the contribution of the Government of Maharashtra. The balance contribution of the Government of Maharashtra shall be limited to Rs. 10 crores which shall be suitably deferred to a date as required by the Government of Maharashtra. The composition of the above contribution in terms of loan and equity shall be decided by the Government of Maharashtra at a later date. This arrangement may be revised as per the agreement in that behalf between the Licensees and the Government of Maharashtra. The Licensees shall take immediate steps to collect in a phased manner to reduce the burden on consumers security deposits in cash from all their consumers, excluding other Licensees and Maharashtra State Electricity Board.

The entire amount of security deposits so collected by the Licensees as stated above shall be treated as part of contribution of Government of Maharashtra for the financing of the said project.

- (4) The area contained within the limits of the Municipal Borough of Lonavla in Poona District.
- (5) The area contained within the Municipal limits of Panvel in Kolaba District.

PART II****Rationalisation of Distribution.**

(Effective 1st July 1980)

(1) The Licensees will transfer to Maharashtra State Electricity Board the Licensees' existing and future consumers, distribution rights, the Licensees' sub-stations, supply facilities and assets at consumers premises in the following areas :—

- (i) Panvel Licence area.
 - (ii) Bhiwandi Licence area.
 - (iii) Lonavala-Khandala Licence area excluding 22/6.6 KV distribution lines from Khopoli which serve the Licensees' head-works.
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- (iv) Bassein Licence area.

The Licensees will continue to supply power at 100/22/6.6KV at the above sub-stations/points of supply as the case may be, for a mutually

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agreed period to enable the Maharashtra State Electricity Board to make its own arrangements.

(2) The Licensees will surrender their distribution rights in Kalyan and Ambernath areas except for the right of bulk supply to :

(i) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board and

(ii) Ordnance Factory at Ambernath at 100 KV.

The Licensees will retain all their present assets in these areas except the outgoing 22 KV lines from Kalyan and Ambernath Receiving Stations and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers' sub-stations.

(3) The Licensees will surrender their distribution rights in Kolshet area served by their 22 KV distribution system excepting for the right of bulk supply to the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. The Licensees will retain all their present assets in this area excepting the outgoing 22 KV feeders from their Kolshet Receiving Station and the Licensees' terminal equipment at the consumers' sub-stations.

(4) The Licensees are agreeable to permit Maharashtra State Electricity Board to take over all their present and future direct consumers in the erstwhile Thana Electric Supply Company License area. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall receive power from the Licensees' Salsette and Kolshet Receiving Stations at 22 KV. The Licensees will retain all their assets in these areas excepting the outgoing feeders and terminal equipment at the consumers' end. In addition, the Licensees will retain the following consumers and feeders :

(i) Bombay Municipal Corporation (BMC) at 100 KV.

(ii) The Licensees' feeders from the Salsette Receiving Station supplying to B.S.E.S. area.

(5) The capacities of the Licensees' transformers at Ambernath, Kalyan and Kolshet 100/22 KV Receiving Stations will be frozen by the Licensees as on the 30th June, 1980, unless otherwise mutually agreed to augment the capacity further. The Licensees shall have the right to supply and the Maharashtra State Electricity Board shall draw power at 22 KV from these Receiving Stations to the extent of transformation capacity already set up by that time. The transformation capacity is understood to mean capacities of all transformers in service and those under installation and required to be installed upto the 30th June, 1980.

(6) The Maharashtra State Electricity Board will have the right to bring in its own Transmission Lines and set up its own Receiving Stations, in the entire area of the Licensees excluding the area currently served by the B.E.S.T. and the B.S.E.S. at any date after 30th June, 1980. The Maharashtra State Electricity Board may take such advance action as may be necessary for the purpose and keep the Licensees informed suitably. The Licensees shall offer all co-operation and accommodation in allowing crossing of their lines by Maharashtra State Electricity Board's lines.

When Maharashtra State Electricity Board creates such facilities it will be ensured that loads supplied at that time by the Licensees from their Receiving Stations in the areas handed over are not reduced except for marginal adjustments.

(7) The transfer of assets on rationalisation of distribution shall be on the basis of provision of Clause 14 of this Licence.

(8) If the Government is satisfied that it has not been possible for the Licensees and Maharashtra State Electricity Board to reach agreement on any point or points mentioned in this part or the Licensees have not been giving to Maharashtra State Electricity Board adequate co-operation and accommodation as required under any of the above provisions in this part, it will be competent to the Government to issue to the Licensee such directions as the Government may in its absolute discretion think necessary for the purpose and thereupon the Licensees shall be under an obligation to abide by the same.

***FOURTH ANNEXURE**

The Licensees shall abide by the following conditions regarding anti-pollution measures :—

- (a) The present units I, II, III and IV should have stricter control which can be achieved by installation of new control equipment having an efficiency of 99 to 99.5 per cent for removal of ~~particulate matter with multicyclones and a bank of ESP and~~ 90 per cent removal of sulphur dioxide by providing high energy scrubbers as shown in Table I hereinafter.

- (b) The new unit will have an electrostatic precipitator, preceded by high efficiency multicyclones for 99.5 per cent removal of particulate matter. An high energy scrubber should be used for removal of 90 per cent sulphur dioxide.

- (c) After adoption of the control equipment, the final emissions therefore would be brought down as tabulated in Tables I and II hereinafter to 15.0 tonnes/day for sulphur dioxide from the present emission of 62 tonnes/day while particulate matter will be reduced so as not to exceed 8.3 tonnes/day from 28 tonnes/day.

- (d) A common stack of not less than 167 metres height be constructed if possible by combining units IV and V for better dispersal of the pollutants.

- (e) The Licensees would give a commitment to restrict emissions stack-wise to the levels of emissions indicated above. In case any stack emission goes above these levels, the unit concerned shall have to be shut down. The Licensees shall provide a continuous stack monitoring system for each stack, open to inspection by the Municipal Corporation of Greater Bombay and Maharashtra Prevention of Water Pollution Board and/or such authorities as may be appointed by the Government of Maharashtra.

- (f) Clearance of the Government of Maharashtra shall be obtained by the Licensees at every stage i.e. design, specifications, contract, installations and performance test of the air pollution control equipments.

- (g) The Licensees shall duly abide by any directions given by the Government of Maharashtra on a report of Municipal Corporation of Greater Bombay and Maharashtra Prevention of Water Pollution Board and or such authority as may be appointed by the Government of Maharashtra in case of violation of any of the above conditions.
