The functions and duties of the Commission

- (1) The functions of the Commission under Section 86 (1) of the Electricity Act (EA), 2003 are as under:
 - 1 Determine the tariff for generation, supply, transmission and wheeling of electricity wholesale, bulk or retail, as the case may be within the State;
 - 2 Regulate electricity purchase and procurement process of distribution licensees including the price at which electricity shall be procured from the generating companies or licensees or from other sources through agreements for purchase of power for distribution of supply within the State;
 - 3 Facilitate intra-State transmission and wheeling of electricity;
 - 4 Issue Licenses to persons seeking to act as transmission licensees, distribution licensees, and electricity traders;
 - 5 Promote cogeneration and generation of electricity from renewable sources of energy;
 - 6 Adjudicate upon the disputes between the licensees and generation companies and to refer any dispute for arbitration;
 - 7 Levy fee for the purposes of the Electricity Act 2003;
 - 8 Specify State Grid Code;
 - 9 Specify or enforce standards with respect to quality, continuity and reliability of service by Licensees
 - 10 Fix the trading margin in the intra-State trading of electricity, if considered, necessary;
 - 11 Discharges such other functions as may be assigned to it under this Act.
- (2) Besides, under Section 86(2) of the Electricity Act 2003, the Commission is also required to give advice to the State Government on (i) promotion of competition, efficiency and economy in activity of the electricity industry, (ii) promotion of investment in electricity industry, (iii) reorganization and restructuring of electricity industry in the State and (iv) matters concerning generation, transmission, distribution and trading of electricity or any other matter referred to it by the State Government.

Section 4 (1) (b) (ii)

The powers and duties of Officers and Employees of the Commission

The Officers and employees are appointed by the Commission in accordance with Section 91 of the Electricity Act, 2003 and Rules prescribed there under. They discharge their official duties in accordance with the directions and instructions given by the Commission from time to time.

Section 4 (1) (b) (vii)

The particulars of any arrangement that exists for consultation with, or representation by, the Members of the public in relation to the formulation of its policy or implementation thereof

While discharging its functions under Electricity Act, 2003, the MERC is required to undertake various activities such as:

- 1. To make Regulations;
- 2. To issue Tariff Orders and Licenses:
 - a) Determination of Tariff
 - b) Grant of License

While discharging the functions, MERC undertakes consultative process in communication with public of its Regulations and Tariff determination as details below:

1) To make Regulations:

The Commission follows a detailed and transparent process before issuing Regulations as specified in Electricity (Procedure for Previous Publication) Rules 2005 issued by Ministry of Power, Government of India. These notified Regulations are laid before both houses of State Legislature as per procedure followed under Section 182 of Electricity Act, 2003.

2) To issue Orders and Licenses:

- a) Determination of Tariff
- b) Grant of License

After the Petition is accepted by the Commission, the Commission determines the stages, manner, place, date and the time of the hearing of the matter, as considered appropriate for expeditious disposal in accordance with the Section 64 of Electricity Act, 2003. The Commission, accordingly directs the Petitioner that the Public Notice of the hearing may be advertised, for seeking suggestions, objections from public normally at least 3 weeks before the date fixed for the hearing, in not less than 2 daily newspapers in English language and in not less than 2 daily newspapers in Marathi language having wide circulation in that area alongwith Petition in brief and Executive Summary thereof. The Petitioner is also directed to make available a copy of the Petition alongwith its enclosures and Executive Summary to the public and also to place it on the web-site of the Petitioner. Accordingly, a Notice is published by the Petitioner inviting suggestions and objections to the Petition from the public.

After taking into consideration all submissions made by the Petitioner, all suggestions and objections from the public, responses of the Petitioner to the said suggestions/objections, issues raised during the public hearing and all relevant material, the final Order is issued by the Commission.

As regards the grant of Licence, the procedure as laid down in Section 15 of the Electricity Act, 2003, is also followed, mainly considering public suggestions / objections. Copy of the Commission's Order is put up on the Commission's web-site. Any affected person can file an Appeal against the Order of the Commission, before the Appellate Tribunal of Electricity.
