Daily Order

During the hearing, Respondents MSEDCL's Advocate stated that it has challenged the Impugned Orders before the APTEL and has also moved an application for stay. He informed that there is a likelihood that these matters be listed before the APTEL in the coming week or the next week. It was also pointed out that Petitioners have also challenged the Impugned Orders

before APTEL. As orders have been challenged by both parties, he suggested that present proceeding be deferred so that it can pursue its application for stay before the APTEL.

Advocate of the Petitioners opposed the adjournment request of MSEDCL and stated that as there in no stay on the Orders of the Commission, the same needs to be enforced. During the hearing, he has referred to WindIndia matter wherein APTEL has directed the Commission to enforce its Orders and the claims that their cases are identical to that of WindIndia. He further stated that in case the Commission decides to adjourn the matter it should not be for more than 2 weeks.

Considering the above, the Commission decided to adjourn these matters for 2 weeks.
